Why I'm Running

I would be honored to earn your support and your vote.

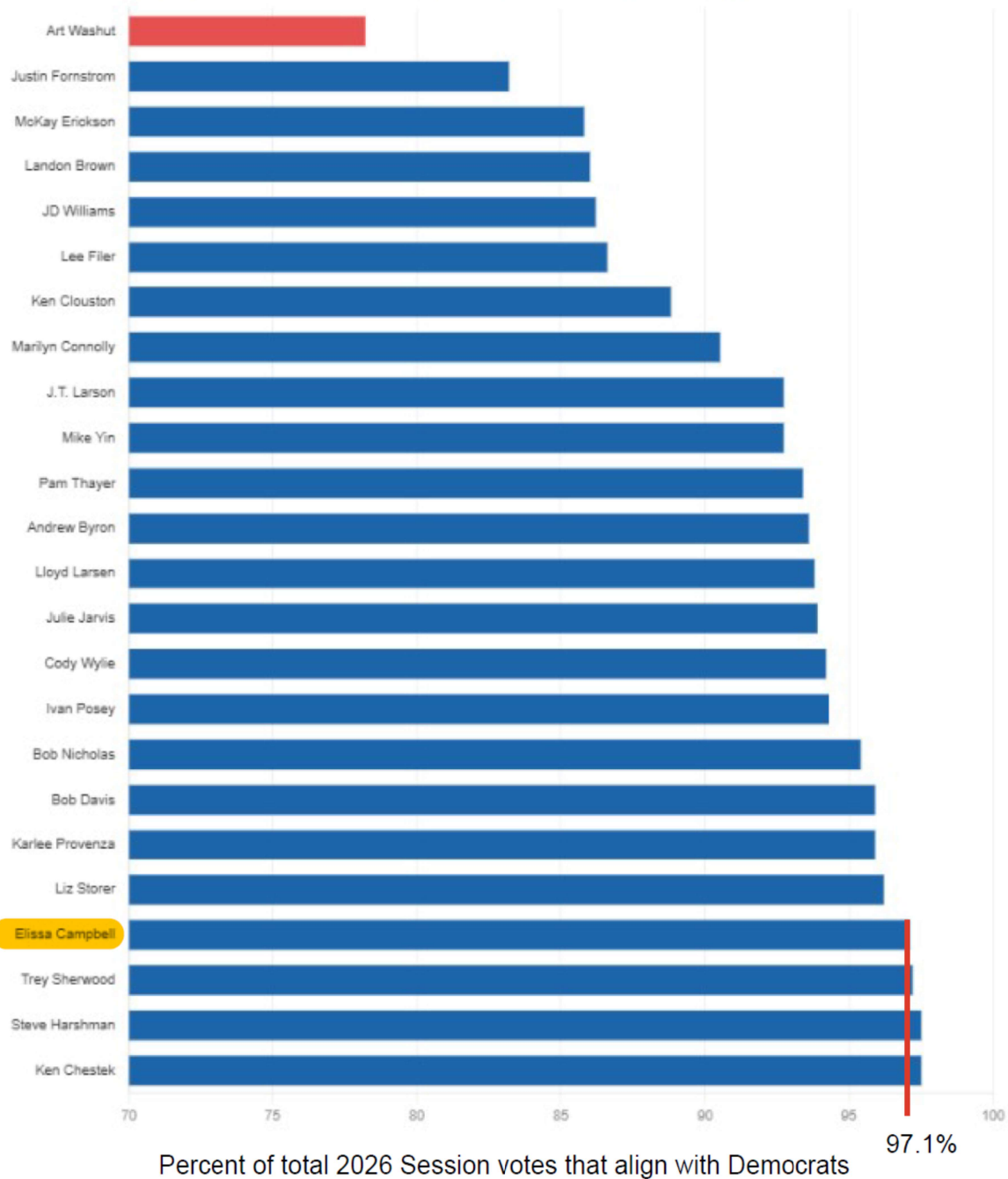
